SUSTAINABILITY SOLUTIONS WE ARE GOING GREEN

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Being a global leader in the industry, ADNOC has implemented a 2030 sustainability initiative and strategy focused on six

main pillars: Climate Emissions and Energy, Local Environment, Economic and Social Contribution, Workforce Diversity and Development, Health Safety and Security, and Business Sustainability. Taking these into consideration, here at ADNOC Technical Academy, we have been diligently working to be part of the change and implement solutions to make our campus greener and friendlier to the environment while leading the way to a more sustainable future.

There have been a few encouraging initiatives taking place on our campus in recent months that we should be proud of:

Placing and distributing recycling and
e-waste bins throughout campus to
recycle 1.5 tons of waste per year.
Bins have been strategically placed,
both inside and outside buildings, and
have been color-coordinated to collect
general waste, paper, plastic, cans,
and e-waste materials. As trainees and
staff actively choose to recycle, they
are helping to extend the lifecycle of a
product, which has a positive impact on

our environment and life sustainability.

- Replacement of single-use plastic water bottles with highly sustainable and innovative, smart, reusable water bottles. Water stations have been set up all throughout campus where trainees and staff members can re-fill their own bottles as they please. This project alone has reduced our singleuse plastic water bottle consumption by 90%. In February 2022, 49,315 single-use water bottles were distributed on campus. In September 2022, that figure fell to 413 water bottles. Every month we have reduced our plastic waste by 700 kg.
- Getting rid of single-use plastic in ATA canteen. Although we have not completely eliminated single-use plastic yet, all plastic bags have been removed and replaced with paper, and plates have been replaced with foam and ceramic reusable ones. We are continuing to work on this initiative until we can reduce our single-use plastic consumption to an even higher degree.



Last on our agenda, but certainly not least, we did not forget about our curriculum in the classroom, to stay in line with current global trends and our core sustainability objectives. We had to consider the implementation of a viable green strategy in the trainees' courses: this is how the new energy curriculum has come to life! This course focuses on subjects like renewable energy, the role of hydrogen as a clean source of energy, the UAE's efforts in the renewable energy sector and more. We believe adding this course to the curriculum will give the trainees a head start to shape their minds to always adapt a green, sustainable mindset as they progress with their promising careers in ADNOC.

As a society, we can't just consume our way to a more sustainable world. However, a small group of strong, determined, and committed people can change the world. That is who we are here at ATA; one step at a time, and we are on our way to making our campus, our environment, and our world... just a bit more sustainable for future generations to come.

The pavilion was designed as a premier Open Day destination and extended until the end of November 2022 to facilitate visits by schools, National Service, and ADNOC employees as well.



Visitors are immersed in a journey through the Academy, accompanied by well-trained tour guides and the Academy graduates. They would start their journey by walking through an immersive wall that sheds light on our mission to prepare young Emiratis to play a vital part in the UAE Oil and Gas industry. Then, they would walk through a tunnel representing the four technical specializations that we offer, where the focus is on the job training nature for each of the skills that they would need to acquire, and the potential career path open to them upon graduation. The visitors had the opportunity to experience the interactive buttons and learn more about the industrystandard plants that mimic the operations of real ADNOC plants, where trainees gain an authentic training experience.

The pavilion also offers the opportunity to know more about the displayed trainees' projects reflecting their talents and skills.





These projects competed in the Emirates Skills competition. Visitors would not miss the massive wall of "Notable Alumni" which displays the names of past graduates who have held managerial and supervisory positions in ADNOC.

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NAJAH ABU DHABI 2022: SECURING QUALITY INTAKE ADNOC Technical Academy has been mandated by ADNOC ELT to work on the highly strategic mission of delivering increased numbers of quality graduates to help ADNOC Group Companies meet self-sufficiency targets in frontline critical positions. This mandate requires a new approach to our communication and marketing strategies so we can reposition the Academy as a preferred destination for high quality Emirati students searching for meaningful technical qualifications and career opportunities.



Accordingly, the Academy took pride in participating in the 16th edition of Najah Abu Dhabi held at the Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Centre (ADNEC) in the period of 16 to 18 October 2022. The Expo provides a strong platform for students to meet with representatives of more than 100 prestigious international universities and be well informed before making the crucial decision of where and what to study after high school.



The ATA stand in Najah Exhibition was honored by the visit of His Excellency Sheikh Nahayan Mabarak Al Nahayan, UAE Minister of Tolerance, along with Dr. Ahmad Belhoul Al Falasi, Minister of Education. Additionally, our stand welcomed around 3,000 visitors, the majority of whom were Emiratis. ATA representatives were also approached during the exhibition by inquirers about our VR goggles, which were apparently trending on social media (TikTok). A considerable increase in the number of registration accounts created by interested students was also observed over the course of the event.





Dr. Saif recognized the dedicated efforts of frontline female colleagues and the enthusiasm and inspiration they brought to the Forum.

Participating VPO added value to the event through different presentations and engaged in focused discussions and the sharing of best practices. ATA management was also able to present our growth plan in light of the Emiratization self-sufficiency mandate.

In his presentation, Mr. Ibrahim Al Zaabi, SVP ATA, stressed the role of operations leaders in promoting and accelerating the collaboration between ATA and ADNOC site leadership. TECHNOLOGY TO STAY AHEAD OF THE CURVE

As we Accelerate 100X, we must stay ahead of the curve and ensure that ADNOC Technical Academy trainees have the knowledge and skills they need to succeed in their critical roles within a challenging and evolving industrial environment. We constantly modify and develop our training systems to ensure they are future-proof and up to date. Accordingly, ATA has started implementing a new technology initiative to enhance trainees' practical experience. The new technology is known as the "Electronic Work Management System Training Simulator," (e-WMS). Simply put, the system mimics the actual production system that controls work permit authorizations at ADNOC Group Companies production facilities.

This simulator, in conjunction with the 3D model that allows us to view the plant production equipment, allows trainees to practice real-work scenarios on ADNOC production sites in a secure and monitored setting. The system is a replica of the genuine system that runs on a standalone server tailored to the ATA training requirements. Our trainees can greatly benefit from this new technology as it enhances their readiness for employment in a constantly changing workplace. The simulator offers practice on how to authorize work permits that create safe environments for performing tasks at the ADNOC production facilities.

Our trainees will gain two main skills from using the simulator: comprehending the permit process flow on the electronic version and creating all necessary documentation in order to ensure safe working conditions, ultimately accelerating our process safety.

This is what Mohamed Humaid Al Maazmi, specializing in Operations had to say about his experience using e-WMS:

"ATA has provided me with an excellent learning environment. The Academy's teaching approach is distinctive in that it incorporates cutting-edge technologies such as a 3D model and e-WMS. You can conduct proper planning and simulate any given scenario that is dealt with at the ADNOC production sites by combining these two technologies. This helps me get a clear understanding of how work is carried out properly from the beginning to ensure a safe environment at our ADNOC operational sites.

I would recommend the ADNOC Technical Academy to anyone looking for a handson learning experience with technologies that make learning enjoyable, motivating, and aligned with ADNOC safety standards. When it comes to continuous improvement to quickly adapt to the rapidly changing site demands, ATA ensures that the training is of high quality." Under the leadership of **His Excellency Dr. Sultan Ahmed Al Jaber**, Minister of Industry and Advanced Technology and Managing Director and Group CEO of ADNOC, and with the support of **Dr. Saif Al Nasseri**, Director, Group Human Capital, ADNOC Technical Academy participated for the first time with an independent stand, along with more than 2,200 exhibiting companies and 28 international exhibiting country pavilions.

Being a part of ADEPIC, the Academy is now placing itself among the leading technical training facilities in the region while simultaneously providing technical and HSE courses with the ADNOC Code of Practice standard, which are based on market demands of the energy sector. Visitors had the opportunity to use two interactive screens for exploring the scope and sequence of the Academy's training programs and facilities: One screen was designed for displaying different training plants in the academy, while the other screen exhibited a useful question-andanswer platform. Visitors also had the opportunity to explore the HSE, English and technical short courses that ATA offers to contractors, trainees, and qualified individuals. The fact that over thirty highly recognized companies displayed interest in collaborating was a highlight at ADEPIC. Areas such as sharing knowledge, promoting internships for graduates, and providing training equipment are essential to supporting growth at ATA. Further discussion on alignments and agreements will take place in upcoming session events. ATA also participated in the Business Partnership Forum of the "Enabling Local Talent in the Private Sector" panel discussion.
