There is no doubt about how exceptional the year 2020 was, however, with ADNOC's leadership, guidance and support, as well our staff resilience & commitment, many challenges turned into opportunities, where we have successfully capitalized on these opportunities to focus our efforts on marking a number of milestone achievements, setting us firmly on the path of achieving our long-term objectives.

Though the COVID-19 pandemic has largely impacted, similar international training industries, here at the Academy, we have adapted innovative approaches to sustain our training and learning continuity while support online registration and enrollment. With the implemented distance learning solutions, and online testing and interviews, we have 399 graduates from the revamped Academy program, while new 166 applicants received enrollment in 2020.



In our pursuit of broader diploma recognition and to strengthen our accreditation, we have acquired Training License from Abu Dhabi Centre for Technical and Vocational Education and Training (ACTVET), in addition to OPITO accreditation to deliver Engineering technology diploma certificates in all four specializations levelled at SCQF 7.

As we start the year 2021, and after sharing our business development plan with stakeholders, our destination is set to focus our approach on few key areas including:

- Leveraging the Academy's performance to One-ADNOC Performance culture.
- Deliver on 10 years graduation plan of confident & competent UAE national workforce.
- Develop the Academy's business commerciality strategy.

ROAD SAFETY

COVID -19 THERMAL CAMERAS

Therefore, advanced thermal cameras were installed at critical locations to ensure the safe return of staff and trainees.

These installed thermal cameras use advanced technology for facial recognition, and include a warning system for people not wearing masks, along with a temperature surveillance feature.

OUR KEY WORD

The outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic pushed the world to respond in unconventional ways. Inspired by one of our company's core values, "Progressive" encouraged us to adapt to the situation with agility. Our plan to enrol September 2020 and February 2021 intake remained and the registration process continued by utilizing new technologies to implement our enrolment processes, such as online admission tests and online interviews.

The percentage of candidates joining Petroleum Core increased from 5% in 2018 to 15% in 2020. A total of 395 candidates took the online test and 166 candidates joined the new program in September 2020.

NEW ACHIEVEMENT NEW ACCREDITATION

The ADNOC Technical Academy has been approved recently by Abu Dhabi Centre for Technical and Vocational Education and Training (ACTVET), the UAE awarding body, to become a licensed training provider, after a successful external audit from ACTVET. The Academy achieved the accolade of Registered Training Provider (RTP) and has now registered National Qualifications Authority (NQA) national qualifications, in addition to the suite of international qualifications we deliver.

The Academy has been delivering Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF) level 5 qualifications in Maintenance and Operations disciplines. However and behind the scenes, the Academy has been working with OPITO, our international awarding body, to build and deliver technical training diplomas at SCQF level 7 for the future. This was successfully achieved in September 2020 and the curriculum has now been completely updated to meet the stringent requirements of the higher qualification. The dialog with NQA continues to align the SCQF 7 diploma qualifications with the Qualifications Framework Emirates level 5 diploma.

ADNOC Technical Academy is now accredited by three awarding bodies: Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA), Offshore Oil Industry Petroleum Organization (OPITO), and the National Qualifications Authority (NQA), demonstrating our commitment to deliver international and national qualifications to the trainees.

SUCCESSFUL WORKING MOTHERS IN THE TIME OF COVID-19

The outbreak of COVID-19 has been very challenging for the entire world. Women in ADNOC have shown great resilience in the light of the pandemic, ensured business continuity, and demonstrated ADNOC values despite imposed restrictions.

Here at ADNOC Technical Academy, women have always been empowered and given the opportunity to grow and succeed. Balancing their responsibilities of taking care of their children and being an effective and reliable employee can be challenging. To ensure business continuity, women with children were granted permission to work flexibly in the office and/or remotely as required across all ADNOC group companies. The new policy allowed women with children in the Academy to balance between meeting business requirements and fulfilling the requirements of distance education for their children.



Accepting the 'New Normal' and life balance were the main challenges that working mothers have faced in the Academy. Maha Yaaqoob Abdulrahman, Pre-Program Coordinator and mother of four children, explained how difficult it was at the beginning to adopt the new means of communication imposed by the pandemic. She said, "I learned a lot through working remotely. During the pandemic, my skills have developed and new programs used made communication with trainees a lot easier than I thought." She added, "I was able to deliver tasks on time and meet the objectives of my role, and fulfil family needs, all from home."



Nesrin Tantawy, an English Language Instructor and a mother, faced the challenge of distance learning, which seemed to her a daunting mission at first. "It wasn't long before we adopted distance learning and utilized technology to ensure that our trainees still received quality education," Nesrin clarified. She added, "Besides, working from home every other week has granted me the opportunity of making sure my kids are not giving their teachers a hard time!"



Rose-Helen Adamo, English Language Instructor, acknowledged the smooth transition adapted by the Academy for distance learning. She said, "Overnight, we had to learn how to teach online and had to conquer an array of challenges. Through this process, however, we have all learned a multitude of new online teaching technology tools to use in our classroom, which has enabled us to create and facilitate innovative and effective lessons."

Women currently represent 11% of the total workforce of ADNOC Technical Academy, in which 48% are mothers with children working across all departments and various fields.
